Paul Meyer is Fellow in International Security and Adjunct Professor of International Studies at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver. Prior to assuming his current appointments in 2011, Mr. Meyer had a 35-year career with the Canadian Foreign Service. Mr. Meyer had diplomatic assignments in Oslo, Moscow, Brussels (NATO), Washington, Tokyo and from 2003-2007 in Geneva where he served as Canada's Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations and to the Conference on Disarmament. At the then Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade's HQ, Meyer held a variety of positions including Director General for International Security (1998-2001) and Director General for Security and Intelligence (2007-2010). Throughout his work, Meyer has sought to promote international security and conflict prevention by means of creative diplomacy. He currently teaches a course on diplomacy at SFU's School for International Studies and beyond academia he is active as a Director and past Chair of the Canadian Pugwash Group, a Senior Advisor with ICT4Peace, a founding Fellow of the Outer Space Institute and a member of the International Panel on Fissile Material. Meyer is engaged in research and writing on issues of Canadian diplomacy, nuclear non-proliferation and disarmament, outer space security and international cyber security.
